Mathematics

Fluency Focus: Numbers with up to at least 3 digits (whole numbers and decimals with up to 1 dp)

Geometry- identifying and drawing a range of regular and irregular 2D shapes.
 Perimeter- Including problem solving using written and mental methods
 Multiplication and Division- distributive and associative laws, worded problems, formal written methods
 Statistics – Pictograms and scaled bar charts
 Fractions- Ordering and comparing, adding and subtracting with the same denominators, problem solving

Pupils are expected to be fluent in times tables 2, 5, 10, 3, 4, 8

Routines & Homework:

- **Weekly spellings:** these are handed out on a Thursday and will be tested the following Tuesday in dictation.
- **Weekly times tables practice** (cards) Children will be tested every couple of weeks to ensure progress is being made
- **Spag.com** – set Thursday to be completed online by Tuesday
- **My Maths** – set Thursday to be completed online by Tuesday
- One piece of maths, writing or topic work may be set when relevant.

PE: Monday Games Lesson: Tuesday

English

Writing: Composition (*effect on audience/ sentence structure and punctuation/ text organisation*) and Transcription (*Handwriting and spelling*) will be taught based on a variety of text.

Narratives/ Discussion/ Explanation and Poetry.

Grammar & spelling: Year 3/4 Common exception words and weekly spelling rules will be taught.

Specific Y3 grammar and punctuation: preposition, conjunction, word family, prefix, clause, subordinate clause, direct speech, inverted commas.

Handwriting: Children will continue to develop a continuous cursive style of handwriting with lead in strokes.

Reading Skills: Children will hear, share and discuss a wide range of high-quality texts to develop a love of reading, support the development of early comprehension and broaden their vocabulary. Books selected from a wide range of fiction, non-fiction, poetry, plays, non-fiction and reference books or textbooks: modern fiction, fiction from our literary heritage and books from other cultures and traditions (including pre-twentieth century titles) and titles by classical children's authors.

Curriculum Information –Roaming Romans

Topic: History: The Roman Empire and its impact on Britain, including Julius Caesar, the invasion by Claudius and the British resistance.

Science: Forces and Magnets- looking at magnetic and non-magnetic objects and how things move
Rocks and soils

Computing: e-safety: Bringing images to life using a range of editing programmes to explore image resizing to decide the best size for screen projection

Spanish: Questions, Numbers, Time, Food, Drink,

PE: Cognitive and Creative, Football and Athletics

RE: Easter (Beliefs and Practices)

Art: Mosaics – To use a range of textures and materials to create a collage

Design & Technology: Plan, design, make & evaluate Roman magnetic board games and choose suitable materials to do so

PSHCE: 'Dreams and Goals' 'Healthy Me'

Music: Rock & Pop Foundation: improvise & compose/ play and perform/ Musical appreciation.
