English

Writing: Composition (*effect on audience/ sentence structure and punctuation/ text organisation*) and Transcription (*Handwriting and spelling*) will be taught based on a variety of text including Journey – Aaron Becker; Wolves in the Walls by Neil Gaiman; The Monsterology Handbook by 'Ernest Drake'; Cloud Tree Monkeys by Mal Peet & Elspeth Graham

Narratives/ Discussion/ Explanation and Poetry.

Grammar & spelling: Year 5 Common exception words and weekly spelling rules will be taught.

Specific Y5 grammar and punctuation: modal verb, relative pronoun, relative clause, parenthesis, bracket, dash, cohesion, ambiguity

Handwriting: Children will continue to develop a continuous cursive style of handwriting with lead in strokes.

Reading Skills: Children will hear, share and discuss a wide range of high-quality texts to develop a love of reading, support the development of early comprehension and broaden their vocabulary.

Books selected from a wide range of fiction, non-fiction, poetry, plays, non-fiction and reference books or textbooks: modern fiction, fiction from our literary heritage and books from other cultures and traditions (including pre-twentieth century titles) and titles by classical children's authors.
